

Maths

- Children will learn to describe and sort shapes based on the shapes' mathematical properties, using the correct terminology. Although this is the first unit covering geometry in Year 2, children have experience of recognising, naming, describing and sorting 2D and 3D shapes from Unit 5 in Year 1. Children will also draw on their counting skills and their ability to compare and order numbers. In this unit, children will learn to describe and categorise shapes based on their number of sides, vertices, edges and faces.

Science

- Children will be using the knowledge that they gained and revisit topics to improve their investigative skills. They will utilise tools available to them to test different concepts and ideas and draw conclusions to test the principles that they learnt about in each of these topics.

ART

- This unit of work develops a range of painting, printing and textiles skills and techniques around a common theme as a stimulus. e.g. Elmer the Elephant (principle link Geometry)

Music

- Use their voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and speaking chants and rhymes
- Play tuned and un-tuned instruments musically
- Listen with concentration and understanding to a range of high-quality live and recorded music
- Experiment and create, select and combine sounds using the inter-related dimensions of music.

Writing
