Topic Web: Spring 1, YEAR 1

READING

We will continue using our reading scheme of work Read, Write Inc. They will learn new sounds, apply them and begin developing fluency.

RELEVANT CROSS-CURRICULAR OBJECTIVES:

WRITING

Children will continue to develop their writing during Spring term. They will write purposeful creative pieces linked to our texts The Naughty Bus and Paddington.

Year 1 will explore writing different genres while focusing on including the common exception words, prefixes and suffixes

MATHS

Children will be learning to continue to subtract and add using numbers within 20, some will be greater numbers. They will also explore numbers up to 50, they will learn to represent these numbers, group them and compare them. They will count numbers in 2s and 5s up to 50. Year 1 will also solve word problems that involve addition and subtraction with numbers up to 50.
