Topic Web: half-term 2, YEAR 1

READING

We will continue using our reading scheme of work Read, Write Inc. They will learn new sounds, apply them and begin developing fluency.

RELEVANT CROSS-CURRICULAR OBJECTIVES:

Children will read a variety of text linked to our theme.

WRITING

Children will explore our theme books, through comprehension and writing for a purpose. Writing outcomes will be diary writing, a letter and producing a non-fiction report about chicks.

MATHS

Children will learn to takeaway, subtract by breaking the whole into parts. Discover related number facts, compare additions and subtractions. Solve word problems.

Name 3D and 2D shapes and make patterns.

Count using ones and tens, compare more than and less than one. Compare numbers of objects, compare and order numbers.

RELEVANT CROSS-CURRICULAR OBJECTIVES:

Children will use the shape patterns in their DT craft. Children will look at what resources were used by children in the past.

COMPUTING

Use technology purposefully to create, organise, store, manipulate and retrieve digital content. Recognise common uses of information technology beyond school. Use technology safely and respectfully, keeping personal information private; identify where to go for help and support when they have concerns about content or contact on the internet or other online technologies. Children will learn the basics of using a laptop- logging in, shutting down, how to use the trackpad, creating and saving documents etc.

DT

To be able to construct a life cycle of a chicken using arts and craft.

RELEVANT CROSS-CURRICULAR OBJECTIVES: Children will be able to identify the different levels in the life cycle of a chicken. They will construct the different levels of the cycle using different techniques such as handprinting, crumpling, gluing, shredding. Mathematical patterns will be used to decorate their life cycle.
